

# Yellow Champ (2)

## Vowel Instructions

### Sh'va :

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When a Sh'va is at the beginning of a word, it is a *short* vowel.

Example: בְּטַח is pronounced **Bitach**

When a Sh'va is in the middle of a word, it is a *silent* vowel.

Example: גַּמְרָה is pronounced **Gam-rah**

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### Note:

When you see a *silent* vowel, it can be helpful to split up the word.

Read the word up until (and including) the letter with the sh'va, **pause**, and then read the rest of the word.

## Yellow Champ (2)

Examples:

(1) חמלה

← Remember: Hebrew reads RIGHT to LEFT!

First read the first part of the word:

חמ = Chem

Pause, and then read the second part of the word:

לה = Lah

All together, you get:

חמלה = Chem-lah

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## Yellow Champ (2)

Examples:

(2) אָמַרְתָּ ← Remember: Hebrew reads RIGHT to LEFT!

First read the first part of the word:

אָמַר = Amar

Pause, and then read the second part of the word:

תָּ = Tah

All together, you get:

אָמַרְתָּ = Amar-tah

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
