Yellow Champ (2) Vowel Instructions

Sh'va:

When a Sh'va is at the beginning of a word, it is a *short* vowel.

Example: דְבַבׁ is pronounced Bitach

When a Sh'va is in the middle of a word, it is a *silent* vowel.

Example: コラグシ is pronounced Gam-rah

Note:

When you see a *silent* vowel, it can be helpful to split up the word.

Read the word up until (and including) the letter with the sh'va, **pause**, and then read the rest of the word.
